## City Manager's Message

The economic recession our country has been struggling through over the last several years has affected everyone. Those who have suffered job losses or business slow-downs have been especially harmed. We have many good people in our community who are helping those most affected and we appreciate their generosity. City revenues have also been affected by the economic slow-down. Sales tax revenue, which makes up approximately 25% of the City's total revenue from taxes, remains down compared to pre-recession levels. Keep in mind that tax revenue is a



critical source of funding that enables the City to provide services such as law enforcement, fire protection, road maintenance, and numerous other public services. We can all help support the many businesses located in Hurricane that are struggling to remain open due to decreased sales. Sadly,

we have seen the closure of several businesses over the past few months. Any time a business closes it affects not only the employees and owners, but other businesses and the community as a whole. As a community, we need to rally around our local businesses and help them succeed! I recognize that in this economic climate we all must watch our budgets and getting the best deal for our dollars is important. However, before we drive into St. George to make a purchase, we all need to consider the added costs in time and fuel. Please think about these costs when comparing prices available in Hurricane to those in St. George or elsewhere. My wife and I have made a special effort to shop more in Hurricane. Of course, there may be items we can't get here in town, but for those things that are available we think it is important to shop here as much as possible. Hurricane has many businesses you might not even know about with great products and services! Please make an effort to check out the local businesses we can all help support. By staying in Hurricane to shop, dine, and obtain services whenever possible we can help our neighbors and friends keep businesses open and employees working! Our efforts will help strengthen our community all while keeping sales dollars and tax revenue here in town which helps provide the City services we all need.

While driving and walking around town, I have observed many places where bushes, trees, and weeds are encroaching on sidewalks and streets. The City has received multiple complaints from residents having difficulty with overgrown public corridors. One resident who recently became disabled has found it extremely challenging to negotiate sidewalks due to overgrown weeds and bushes. As citizens, we all need to do our part

to manage vegetation on our properties. Please make sure to prune any bushes that extend into the sidewalk or any trees that hang too low over the sidewalk or street. Vacant lots, especially in subdivisions where lots have been graded, are especially prone to problems with tumbleweeds growing over onto sidewalks. In order to eliminate tumbleweeds, they need to be dug up and removed or burned in accordance with burn permit regulations. It is the responsibility of each property owner to address problems on his or her property. Some citizens would like to have the City address these types of issues on private property, but the cost would be far too great to have City crews do so. Additionally, when crews do have to trim bushes or trees for reasons of public safety, residents are often unhappy with the results. It is far better to have property owners manage their own landscapes. Please be considerate of your neighbors, especially school children and the disabled, by keeping sidewalks clear from bushes, trees, and weeds.



The function of city governments is to provide services that citizens cannot provide for themselves. Hurricane City provides fire protection and ambulance service, law enforcement, parks, streets, building inspections, recreation facilities and programs, culinary water service, and electricity service as well as other miscellaneous services. However, there are many functions that government should not be expected to provide. Many citizens express concern about the size of government, but the size and cost of government continues to grow as



citizens continue to expect more from the government. If we want fewer taxes and smaller government, then we need to demand less from the government, not more. Many of the complaints received by my office, the Mayor, and

members of the City Council are about issues like sidewalks, curb and gutter, or weeds. Although gutters and sidewalks are indeed property of the City, we would need to hire many more employees in order for the City to keep all of these areas cleaned and free of weeds. With a little effort from property owners and residents, as well as neighbors helping less-able neighbors, we can make Hurricane a better and even more beautiful place to live, without adding to the tax burden.

## Tree Board

The Hurricane City Tree Board is sponsoring an irrigation workshop on Friday, March 7, 2014. The two-

hour workshop will be held at 10:00 a.m. at the Hurricane Community Center, 63 South 100 West.

Experts from Utah State University extension service and other professionals will present information about tree irrigation, landscape planning, and efficient irrigation practices. This workshop is sponsored as a public service and is free to attend.


### Volunteer Services

### Building Department

If you are considering installing a block wall on your property, please make sure you are aware of all requirements that must be met. Did you know that block walls must be installed by a licensed contractor and a building permit from the City is required? Hurricane City



ordinance also limits the height for block walls: No fence, wall, or similar structure *exceeding six feet (6')* shall be erected in any rear or side yard except for permitted accessory buildings and structures *without* an approved conditional use permit (H.C.C. 10-37-9).

If you are planning to have a block wall constructed on your property, you must submit a building permit and site plan to the Building Department for approval **prior to beginning construction**. The permit fee is \$25.00 per side plus a State surcharge of \$1.00 per side. Inspections will include footings, grout, and completion. In order to expedite a wall permit, make sure the wall and footings will be located *completely* on your property. ## Hurricane Valley School and Community Garden

A new garden season has arrived and we are planning a wonderful year of growing, learning, and meeting new friends! The garden is a community collaborative project of valley residents, Hurricane High School students and the Future Farmers of American (FFA) club, the City of Hurricane, and many other civic organizations and local businesses. Come join us and be a part of growing something beautiful for our community! Garden offerings this year include:



**Garden Bed Rental.** Rent your own space for growing! The seasonal fee for rental of a garden bed is \$35 plus a \$30 refundable cleaning deposit. The season runs from February to November. Raised beds are tilled and fitted with an irrigation system.



Gardeners provide their own *organic* amendments, fertilizers, plants, and seeds. Weeding is *not* optional! All gardeners will be required to fulfill weekly weeding responsibilities in their beds. Hurricane City provides water and power for the garden and experienced volunteers oversee the watering program and help gardeners as needed. Monthly classes with Ali Reynolds of Ali's Organics give gardeners help and new insights into organic gardening practices. Students from Mr. Dayley's plant and soil science classes at the high school work in the garden each week, helping to implement and support the garden mission. Other community volunteer groups and individuals offer help and support throughout the season.

**Co-operative Garden.** Come help in the co-op garden beds and receive a variety of fresh and wonderful veggies, fruit, flowers, herbs, and nuts on a weekly basis. The minimum commitment for participation is two hours of work in the garden per week.

**Volunteer Opportunities.** Come as individuals or groups to provide community service in the garden! We have had a variety of individuals, clubs, and groups work with us for an evening, a once-per-month project, or an all-season commitment. We greatly appreciate volunteers who serve in the garden! Volunteers help weed, prune, plant, harvest produce, pick fruit, and feed animals. There is always something fun to do and learn in the garden. Call to schedule an hour or two of service for your group, club, or family activity!

**Garden Classes and Socials.** Pot luck socials at the beginning and end of the garden season along with monthly organic gardening classes are included with garden bed rentals, but any interested community member may sign up and attend as well. Ali Reynolds of Ali's Organics in LaVerkin addresses pertinent garden topics during monthly classes and she tours each garden bed to answer questions and give advice. The "Taster's Table" at the end of each class provides samples of fun, new ways to use in-season produce.



Regardless of the level of involvement that suits you, we hope you will join us in the garden this season!

## Police Department Emergency Management

The Hurricane Police Department and Emergency Services have begun offering the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program. The CERT program provides disaster preparedness training for community members related to hazards that may impact the local area. Training includes basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. In the event of a disaster, CERT members will be able to use their training to assist others in their neighborhood or workplace when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members are also encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking an active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

## Community Policing

We want to take the opportunity to remind citizens of the importance of locking up and securing homes, vehicles, and other valuables. In February, we saw an increase in vehicle burglaries. In most cases, these vehicles are being entered through an unlocked door or a window left down. Leaving vehicles unsecured makes it all too easy for criminals to take valuables left inside. Most criminals are looking for an easy target and it takes only seconds for a theft to occur. Our officers and detectives have had good success catching these criminals, but each case takes a lot of hard work and dedication of time. These types of crimes are largely preventable and we are asking for the help of residents to stop these crimes of convenience. Please do your part to make it *as difficult as possible* for would-be criminals to steal your property.



## Special Events

Our beautiful spring weather makes Hurricane an attractive location for many outdoor events. These events bring many visitors and associated traffic to town. We ask that all motorists use extra caution and courtesy during these events. If you plan ahead to give yourself a little extra time to get where you need to go and exercise patience with any delays, your travel will be safer and less stressful. Events including the Sand Hollow Marathon, Hurricane Half Marathon & 5K, and Ironman 70.3 will impact traffic routes in Hurricane. Please make sure you are aware of any road closures, lane closures, or detours that may affect your regular travel routes. Take time to plan ahead if you will need to take alternate routes during these events. With planning and patience we can make sure these events are safe and enjoyable for everyone!

## Off-Highway Vehicles (OHVs)

Southern Utah is a great place for off-highway vehicle enthusiasts! Hurricane is home to the annual Tri-State ATV Jamboree held each March. This popular event showcases the beautiful OHV trails throughout the area. We ask that residents be mindful of OHV riders in town for the Jamboree. Please use extra caution to ensure everyone can enjoy a safe experience!

The Police Department continues to see widespread abuse of the City off-highway vehicle ordinance (H.C.C. 7-1-8). There is a **common misconception** that operating OHVs on all City streets for any reason is permitted. Residents need to be aware that **the operation of OHVs within the City is permitted ONLY when traveling to and from a designated trailhead along those streets**



**designated as OHV access routes.** The full content of the OHV ordinance can be found on the City website. Police officers have been directed to strictly enforce the City ordinance and State laws pertaining to OHVs and will be issuing *citations on the first offense* and will *impound the OHV on any subsequent offenses*. These laws exist to keep OHV riders safe and protect others sharing

the roads. Please help us keep the streets safe for all users by abiding by OHV laws.

### Traffic Laws

We would like to remind motorists of the importance of obeying *all* traffic laws and regulations. Our officers are tasked with enforcing these laws to help ensure *everyone* can travel safely in our community. There has been an increase in violations for speeding, failing to stop at stop signs, following too closely, and improper use of left lanes. Please drive responsibly and abide by the rules of the road!

Drivers should also be aware of rules for the **flashing yellow left arrow** in use at several of the UDOT traffic signals on State Route 9 and other areas throughout the State. The flashing yellow left arrow is a *yield* signal – motorists may turn left *only* after yielding to *pedestrians or oncoming traffic*. To learn more, please see the

### **Animal Control**

As a reminder, all dog licenses issued in 2013 expired on December 31<sup>st</sup> regardless of when they were purchased during the year. Late fees are now applied on all renewals. License tags are available *only* at the Animal Shelter after February 28<sup>th</sup>. New residents are required to license dogs after 30 days of residency in Hurricane – late fees do not apply on an initial license. Citations will be issued for failing to obtain a dog license! To purchase a tag, please bring proof of rabies vaccination to the Animal Shelter located at 2084 South 700 West. If you have any questions about licensing requirements and fees, please contact us at (435) 635-8314.

Spring is arriving in Hurricane and as the weather warms up, more and more residents will be out walking and jogging. Please ensure that your pets are properly contained on your property in order to eliminate confrontations between citizens and dogs. Most dogs can't resist the impulse to defend their property or chase someone running past their yard, especially if another dog is with the passersby.

Dog owners should be aware that it is unlawful to allow animals to defecate on the sidewalk, private property, or any public area without removing and properly disposing of such waste. Violators are *subject to citation*. Reuse your plastic grocery bags – carry one along any time you walk your dog around town. Everyone will appreciate your efforts!



Best Friends Animal Sanctuary is organizing another Super Adoption Event for Friday and Saturday, April 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>. The pet adoption event will be held at one of the dog-friendly parks in St. George. All area animal shelters and rescue groups will have animals available for adoption at the event. As event details are finalized, updates will be posted! Plan to join us – you might just find a new family member to bring home!

### **Water Department**

We need customers' help keeping water meter barrels accessible by ensuring a two foot radius around meter lids is kept free of debris and landscaping. The Water Department needs this access to perform periodic maintenance of water meters and connections. Any time you are making landscape changes, please be sure you are not covering up or otherwise inhibiting access to your water meter. Please be mindful of water meters during spring cleaning and pruning. We sincerely appreciate the efforts of residents who keep their meters accessible for City crews!



Spring is arriving in Hurricane and we know summer will follow close behind! *Time-of-day watering restrictions* take effect **June 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup>**. During these months, **outside watering is prohibited between the hours of 10:00 am and 8:00 pm**. Large agricultural lots that require additional time for watering are exempted from these restrictions; however, all water users should make every effort to maximize water resources by irrigating responsibly.

As a reminder, any customer who has an outdoor watering system connected to the culinary water supply is **required** to have a backflow device installed. This device prevents bacteria and other contaminants from entering the main water lines. Backflow devices **must be inspected annually by a certified backflow technician**. Contact Connie at the Water Department for a list of certified technicians in our area. ### **Cemetery**

Memorial Day will be Monday, May 26<sup>th</sup>. The Parks & Cemetery crews will be working hard to make sure the cemetery is in beautiful condition for the holiday. To allow for the flowers and decorations that will be placed on gravesites for Memorial Day, crews will not do any regular maintenance of the cemetery from Friday, May 23<sup>rd</sup> through Sunday, June 1<sup>st</sup>. The public is welcome to decorate the graves of loved ones during this period. **At 7:00 am on Monday, June 2<sup>nd</sup>, crews will begin cleaning up the cemetery in order to get back to the regular maintenance schedule. We ask that all decorations be removed BEFORE this time.** Any decorations that are *not* in permanent holders attached to the headstone and ALL glass will be discarded by cemetery crews. *For the protection of our personnel, we ask that NO GLASS OR ROCKS be placed on or around headstones throughout the year.*



### **Parks Department**

With our mild winters and sunshine throughout most of the year, outdoor recreation is a way of life in Hurricane. Parks promote this way of life and provide valuable benefits to the community. Our parks offer amenities such

as open space, picnic areas, play structures, and ball fields.

### Sky Mountain Maintenance

If you have played the front nine at Sky Mountain recently, you probably noticed the work going on near the green on hole #4. We are in the process of constructing a brand new green for this hole that will replace the infamous #4 green! Since Sky Mountain opened, golfers have battled the excessive slope – 7 feet from back to front – of this green. We are excited to finally have the opportunity to improve the full tee-to-green experience on this hole!



The new #4 green will be framed by a natural backdrop of lava-rock and desert landscape. The green is designed and being constructed to provide plenty of challenge, but a more fair golf experience. We will also be relocating a section of the cart path to go around the new green, realigning some of the fairway approach, putting in some new bunkers, and adding more trees to create separation between holes 4 and 5. Additionally, we are constructing a new tee box and will be changing some of the existing tees

to provide golfers with a better look at the new green over the fairway hill.

We are aiming to have the new green ready for play this fall. But, there will be *no* interruption of play during the construction process. The existing green will be kept in play until the new green is opened so golfers will continue to be able to enjoy the full 18-hole Sky Mountain experience. Once the new green is opened to play, we will be screening off the old green with trees and leaving it in place as a nursery green.



We greatly appreciate the generous assistance of community members and other City departments, especially the Water and Public Works departments, who have contributed manpower, expertise, and equipment for the renovation and construction on hole #4. We are so lucky to have City resources and cooperation we can draw from to help us keep most of the construction in-house and greatly reduce the cost of the renovations.

We have scheduled our spring greens aerification for May 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup>. To accommodate this essential, twice-yearly maintenance, only 9 holes will be open for play on these days. The full 18 holes will re-open on Friday, May 9<sup>th</sup>.

### Swimming Pool
