

Peach Days 2018

When the sultry summer days are getting shorter, and the nights begin to cool off, we know that - with a promise of fun and entertainment for all - “Peach Days: A Celebration of our Heritage” is fast approaching! This is our 20th year, and will be held August 30, 31 and Sept 1. It is a small town celebration you will not want to miss. This well-loved event is also the base for many family and class reunions. Complete with food, entertainment, displays, and contests for all, Peach Days has become what is said to be the 5th largest event of its kind in the state of Utah.

As your family enjoys this summer, the Peach Days committee would like to encourage you to use some of that time to look ahead at how you can be involved – especially in the displays. The display areas awards ribbons, with cash for sweepstakes, reserve, and some blue ribbons. Entries can be made in **Fine Arts** (oils, watercolors, pencil, charcoal, pen, ink, mixed media, photography and 3D,) **Home Arts** (crafts, sewing, quilts, tole, woodworking, dolls, dried flowers, etc) and **Garden, Baked and Bottled** (garden produce, flowers, small farm display, crate displays, bottled and baked goods.) Judging is in youth and adult categories.

The “**Small Farm Display**” is new this year. They will be judged against each other (like the crate displays are). This will be a larger display of items you have “farmed” – including fruits and vegetables, eggs, flowers, bottled and dried produce, etc. It can be creatively displayed (with props included or only the produce.) This is an area you can showcase the large variety of items you grow instead of entering separately. (You may also enter other items separately as individual fruits, vegetables, canned or baked.) If you are interested in a crate display, get a crate in advance (also from Paula Hirschi), and fill it with a variety of produce or canned goods to compete against other crate displays.

Also new this year: the **rodeo will be moved from Saturday to Friday night**, and Saturday night will now have **Boxing, to be held at the Heritage Park!** There are also many other events to enter: **12K Fun Run, Peach Cook off, Parade, Eating and Bingo contests, or the Pioneer Canal Treks**. And there will be the usual events to enjoy such as Pioneer Corner, amazing entertainment and concerts, food and commercial booths, and the carnival with bounce houses, rides, climbing wall and other venues.
