







Citations by Month










Three Year Totals - Accidents




Accidents by Month



Accidents 3 Year Totals





East/West Side Divider runs



- ▣ **200%** Increase of Prescriptions Collected which helps prevent prescriptions getting into the hands of children and criminals or having them dumped into the sewer systems.
