

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF HURRICANE, UTAH REGARDING RIGHTS AND LIBERTY.

WHEREAS the City of Hurricane employs hundreds of individuals and wishes to avoid situations in which City employees, officers, or elected officials are unaware of the City's commitment to and understanding of liberty and individual rights; and

WHEREAS the Constitution of the United States and Bill of Rights protect fundamental rights and liberty endowed by our Creator; and

WHEREAS the Constitution of the State of Utah establishes that all people have inherent and inalienable rights to enjoy and defend their lives and liberties; and to acquire, possess and protect property; and to worship according to the dictates of their consciences; and to assemble peaceably; and

WHEREAS the separation of powers set forth in the Constitutions of the United States and State of Utah are to assure the preservation of liberty; and

WHEREAS the United States and the State of Utah derives its just powers from the consent of the governed to secure the rights and blessings of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness; and

WHEREAS civil liberties face grave dangers of curtailment when governments declare indefinite or repeated states of emergency; and

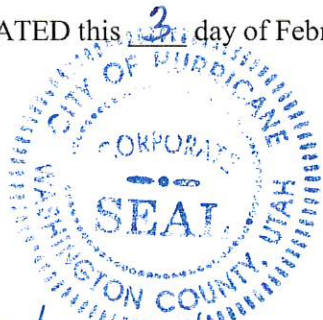
WHEREAS nationwide and within the State of Utah governmental agencies are imposing mask and vaccine rules and or mandates; and
